SKY RANCH COVID-19 RESPONSE & BEST PRACTICES

Sky Ranch recognizes the emergence of COVID-19 has already and will continue to change the way people choose to gather. In an effort to provide guest groups with an excellent experience, **we are committed to**

- ✓ Working with guest groups to provide a safe environment for participants, leaders, and Sky Ranch staff
- ✓ Providing an atmosphere for growth, fun, and connection with modifications for increased safety

WHAT SKY RANCH WILL DO

Sky Ranch Staff Interactions

While interacting with participants and one another, Sky Ranch Staff will actively practice either social distancing (maintaining separation of at least 6' from others) or utilize face coverings.

Food Service

Groups will be assigned to their own tables, which will be socially distanced from those of other groups. The queue for entering the dining room will be regulated by staff, ensuring only one group is in the queue at a time. Serving methods (family style, self-serve, buffet, salad bar, staff plating) will be adjusted to limit potential cross-contamination.

Meeting Rooms

Sky Ranch Staff will work with groups in the assignment and configuration of meeting rooms to ensure (1) each group has exclusive use of its own meeting room, and (2) the meeting space is configured in a way that allows members of large groups to practice social distancing from those not in the same cabin pod.

Public Areas

High touch areas such as doors, counters, faucets, etc. will have an increased sanitization frequency. Social distancing measurements will be added to activities where queues are necessary.

WHAT WE ASK YOU TO DO

Pre-Trip Health Screening

Sky Ranch recommends every participant pass an initial health screening prior to departing for Sky Ranch. This should include a temperature check and confirmation that the participant is not experiencing any of the known symptoms of COVID-19. If any symptoms emerge, the individual in question should not participate in the event.

Increased Health Risks

If an individual is included in the CDC list of those who need to take extra precautions, it is recommended they do not attend.

Daily Health Checks

Sky Ranch asks that groups monitor participants' health through daily temperature checks and by asking symptoms screening questions. Any individuals with symptoms should be isolated from the rest of the group.

Create "Pods"

For large groups, break participants into "pods" of individuals who are already accommodated in cabins together. All travel, meals, activities, and close interactions should be done with "podmates."

Practice Social Distancing and Wear Face Masks

Practice social distancing, wherever possible, by maintaining a distance of 6 feet from others. When this is not possible, or in common areas, wear a face covering.
