

PK-3/PK-4 Toilet Training Policy

Children that are enrolling in a PK-3 or PK-4 class will be expected to be fully toilet trained. Promotion to a PK-3 class is contingent upon being successfully toilet trained (definition below). Children that are not trained by the start of school in a PK-3 classroom will be given one additional month to master the skill. After this period, PK-3 and PK-4 children that are not trained will be asked to remain at home until they are ready for their new class. Tuition will be charged while toilet training is being mastered at home and the child's spot will be held within the classroom while tuition is paid.

The definition of being toilet trained is as follows:

- The child can use the restroom (urinate and BM), at home and at school, independently with minimal assistance and minimal accidents.
 (Less than two a month)
- The child wears underwear all hours of the day. (naptime included)
- The child can communicate to let the caregiver know when they need to use the toilet.
- The child can pull their own pants up and down independently.
- The child can wash their hands independently.
