GALATIANS 5

KEY POINTS

God is our helper. • When we believe in Jesus, He gives us the Holy Spirit to help us.

BIG PICTURE QUESTION

What are the fruits of the Spirit? They are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

MEMORY VERSE

Pray without ceasing and give thanks in all circumstances. 1 Thessalonians 5:17-18

PREPARE



Take time to reflect on today's lesson.

LEADER BIBLE STUDY

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." - Galatians 5:22-23

Just like a tree shows what kind it is by the fruit it produces, our lives show what's happening inside our hearts. In Galatians 5, we are told the kinds of "fruit" that should grow in the lives of people who belong to Jesus and walk by the Holy Spirit.

Take a moment to have some fresh fruit this week. Feel the texture and notice the color. Isn't fruit amazing? Think about fruit of the Spirit and the goodness and sweetness of actual fruit. How much more important is fruit of the Spirit!

Our lives are like these fruits. The Holy Spirit grows good fruit in us—things like kindness, patience, and love. But sometimes, we let sin spoil our fruit, making our attitudes and actions rotten. That's why the Bible tells us to examine ourselves and to let the Spirit lead us. When we walk closely with God, we produce good fruit that blesses others.



Connect with children as service starts

Threes & Fours: Using the provided poster, review the Ten Commandments with the children in your class. Read through each one, then have children repeat after you as you say them together.





Help children with a craft connected to the Bible lesson.

CRAFT: FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT SHEET

Pass out the provided fruit of the Spirit craft sheets and crayons/markers. Help children complete both sides of the sheet: the "match the shadow" sheet and the "good fruit, bad fruit" sheet.

As you work, talk about fruit and review the fruits of the Spirit! Make sure every child's name is on their craft sheet somewhere.

BABIES & TWOS BIBLE LESSON

Read the provided Fruit of the Spirit book and Sing the Fruit of the Spirit song:

BIBLE TIME



Review the Bible lesson with your class.

THREES & FOURS BIBLE LESSON

Talk about fruit! Ask children what their favorite fruit is, or if there's any fruit they don't like. Look at the provided Fruit of the Spirit cards. Talk about the real fruit they represent and their characteristics. What color are they? How do we describe their taste?

Talk about how, just as we can identify fruits we eat, we can also learn to identify spiritual fruit in our lives. Read Galatians 5:22-23 from the Bible in your classroom: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law."

Show the provided Fruit of the Spirit cards and talk through them. Talk about ways that we grow good fruit in our lives. One important way is to ask God to help us grow good fruit!

Talk about ways that farmers make sure their crops grow strong, such as removing weeds or watching for pests. Explain that we need to tend our relationships, especially with Jesus, just as a farmer cares for his farm.

Continue to engage children near the end of the morning.

SNACK & DISCUSSION

Have everyone wash their hands, then serve a snack. Ask the following questions and retell parts of the lesson as needed.

- 1. What was your favorite part of today's Bible lesson?
- 2. What did you learn about God in today's Bible lesson?
- 3. What is one thing we can do to grow good fruit in our lives?
- 4. What are the fruits of the Spirit? They are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

CLOSING ACTIVITIES

Sing the clean up song. Have children help put toys on tables.

Gather them on the rug in a circle and have one volunteer read today's Bible lesson from the children's Bible. Have a regular Bible ready as well.

Sing the "B.I.B.L.E." and "Everything in the Bible is Absolutely True" songs. Remind children that the Bible is God's Word and the most important book in the whole world!

The other volunteer should stand at the door and help with pick up, matching stickers, gathering children's things, etc.
